WHO PAYS FOR HOSPICE CARE?

Hospice care is covered by Medicare A, Medicaid, HMOs, Veterans Administration and many private insurance companies. Coverage generally includes team visitations, medications, equipment and supplies related to the terminal condition.

WHY HOSPICE?

According to a 2010 study in the New England Journal of Medicine, patients receiving early palliative care experienced less depression, had better quality of life, and survived 2.7 months longer.

Catholic Community Hospice can play a key role in managing physical symptoms of a disease (palliative care) and supporting patients and families emotionally and spiritually.

An individual care plan is created and tailored to meet the needs and wishes of each patient and their family:

Nurses and on-call staff are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to address questions and concerns.

Medical equipment and medications to manage pain and symptoms related to the terminal illness are provided at no cost.

Social Workers provide emotional support and can connect you with additional resources as needed.

Home Health Aides assist with bathing and personal care.

Chaplains provide spiritual care within the framework of your beliefs and faith traditions.

Specially trained volunteers offer companionship and respite care for patients and caregivers.

Grief support and recovery services offer guidance, comfort and hope during the illness and beyond. Support for bereaved families extends 13 months beyond the death of a loved one.

provides care, comfort and support to address physical, emotional and spiritual needs of patients and families facing a life-limiting illness. A ministry of the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas, our interdisciplinary hospice team serves people of all faiths by offering guidance, peace of mind and compassionate end-of-life care. Our goal is to care for the whole person – body, mind and spirit.

We understand the impact a serious illness has on patients and their loved ones – from disbelief and anger, to sadness, fear and uncertainty – our team will help you navigate the sensitive end-of-life concerns you may be experiencing. Family members often tell us “we could never have gone through this without you.”

Hospice provides an opportunity to enhance the life of a loved one facing a life-limiting illness.

Specialized care is available in your home, assisted living community, skilled nursing facility and hospitals. Our team comes to you.

Informational visits are available to patients and families at any time, without cost; there is no need for a physician’s order to learn more about care options available to you. When a doctor determines hospice is appropriate, care is started. Patients may choose to continue seeing their primary care physician or elect to have one of our medical directors manage their care.
